unattractive and unhealthy, that can be very distracting," he says. "Rejuvenating your smile can give you a new outlook on life."

Two of the fastest growing segments of his practice are custom-fit dentures and dental implants. Dr. Asmar reports that dentures should be replaced every seven to 10 years, and that sometimes people just let them go too long.

"Replacing old dentures with new ones provides life-changing results on several fronts," he says. "Not only does it give the person a beautiful new smile of their own choosing, but with secure dentures in place, people can eat anything they want. The

number one complaint of denture wearers is that the dentures move when they chew. So, over time, as the dentures age, patients move to a diet of soft foods. That diet is often high in calories and lacking in the essential vitamins and minerals people need."

Dr. Asmar says that with secure new dentures in place, patients can eat anything they want, from steak to broccoli to corn on the cob.

Another plus of properly fit dentures is that patients can avoid developing a "witchy" chin that juts out because of bone density loss and a forward shift in the jaw.

"In many cases, I attach dentures with a dental implant for the best fit and security," he says. "The photos that accompany this story are of Tim. For the best placement, first I assessed the bone's density, quantity and quality. I extracted his old teeth that needed to go and was able to custom fit his new smile."

According to Tim, "I don't know why I put this off for so long. Maybe I thought pulling the bad teeth would be painful, but it wasn't at all. Over the years I started smiling less and showing less and less teeth.

Now I've got a lot more to smile about. The whole experience was a pleasant one, as was getting to know Dr. Asmar and his friendly staff."

Patients who hate going to the dentist are a pretty common occurrence, Dr. Asmar notes, that's why he says one of his favorite parts of the job is when patients say how much they love coming to see him.
